

Table Clinic Presentations Overview Requirements & Guidelines ACP New York Section Fall Meeting

Overview

The purposes of the table clinic presentations are to promote the research of prosthodontics residents and to engage predoctoral dental students and postgraduate prosthodontic residents. A table clinic can be a presentation of research results, clinical outcomes, laboratory techniques, or topics of general interest to the American College of Prosthodontists' members and guests. It is intended to highlight the scholarly activity of the residents and dental students, and commercial presentations are not appropriate for this session.

The table clinics will be in poster format similar to AADR/IADR with the guidelines outlined below. **Abstracts are due Two weeks prior to the date of the Fall Meeting.**

Requirements:

- Must be currently enrolled in 3-4-year advanced training program in prosthodontics which is accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association or a DDS/DMD dental program accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association. Additionally, graduates who completed an accredited prosthodontics residency program within 6 months prior to the Fall Meeting are also encouraged to participate.
- Must be a member of the ACP or eligible for membership. You may submit your membership application concurrent with your table clinic application for review. DDS/DMD students join as a Predoctoral Alliance Member and eligible residents join as a Student Member (see the following link for additional information: <http://www.gotoapro.org/prosthodontic-resources/join-acp/membership-categories>)
- The primary presenter is **required** to register for the meeting prior to being accepted. No abstracts will be accepted until they have registered for the meeting. **The registration fee will be waived for the presenter(s).**
- The primary presenter must present the Table Clinic Presentation and be present at their poster during the required time to answer questions.
- Commercial presentations will not be considered.

Guidelines for Table Clinic Poster Preparation:

- Title of the table clinic and the presenter's name(s) (maximum of 2 presenters) must be clearly displayed at the top of the poster.
- The table clinic must be in poster format, which can be secured with pushpins to a bulletin board. Bulletin boards, 4' x 8', will NOT be provided. Presenters are responsible for poster support, boards, and other items. Lights WILL be provided.
- There will be a table, but no electrical outlets available.
- Text, photographs, diagrams, and charts must be large enough to be read from a distance of three feet.
- Photographs should be no smaller than 8" x 10" for ease of viewing.
- The text should be consistent with the Glossary of Prosthodontic Terms, 8th Edition.
- Presentations must be limited to five minutes. The question-and-answer period should be limited to 5 minutes.
- Table clinic topics should be supported with substantial documentation to ensure credibility.
